

The Netherlands invites civil servants and entrepreneurs from Algeria and Egypt to apply for a professional development course on the role of the government in the ecosystem for entrepreneurs.

The objective of the course is to provide civil servants and entrepreneurs with knowledge and skills on how to facilitate an enabling environment for entrepreneurs and to foster exchange between entrepreneurs and the public sector. The course also aims at strengthening participants' ties with the Netherlands and stakeholders in the Dutch ecosystem for entrepreneurs.

The 'Ecosystem for entrepreneurs' professional development course

A good business environment stimulates the creation of new businesses and is of great importance for the economic development of the MENA region. The government plays an important, condition-creating and stimulating role in this. It must first of all ensure that the basic infrastructure is in place, such as good accessibility to cities and regions, good education, and facilities such as electricity and broadband. In addition, it must develop targeted policies for entrepreneurs and startups, through legislation and regulations, access to knowledge and capital, the creation of networks, the facilitation of housing, and (financial) incentives. This must be based on a clear vision and strategy that has been established in consultation with the various stakeholders.

Objectives

The programme aims to support the participants in building this enabling environment for entrepreneurs. Specifically it aims to achieve the following results:

- A better understanding of the importance of entrepreneurship for society and for individuals;
- A good picture of the implications of (national) policy on entrepreneurs and incubators;
- Increased knowledge and insight about facilitating an ecosystem for entrepreneurs from organizational and policy perspectives;
- Better insight on the roles of the various stakeholders in the ecosystem and how they can better work together;
- Understanding of the ingredients needed for a good ecosystem and possible interventions to achieve them;
- Skills to effectively perform their role as a 'change agent';
- Action plan(s) development to stimulate entrepreneurship at home;
- Implementation of the action plan;
- A network among the participants, the trainers and the guest speakers to exchange knowledge and practical tips in the field, to stimulate entrepreneurship

Course outline and content

The programme duration will be 1.5 years. It consists out of a combination of training workshops in-country and in the Netherlands. In between workshops participants are expected to work on developing and implementing actions plans.

Phase 1: A one-day training in the participants' home countries dedicated to mapping the ecosystem for entrepreneurs.

Phase 2: A one-week training in the participants' home countries. Participants will examine the ecosystems for entrepreneurship in their own country, visit relevant local stakeholders, and write an action plan to strengthen the ecosystem for entrepreneurs.

Phase 3: Three months to further develop the action plans. Coaching will be available.

Phase 4: A seven-day training in the Netherlands, during which participants will visit several Dutch stakeholders in the field of entrepreneurship and finalise their action plans.

Phase 5: Six months to implement the action plans. Coaching will be available.

Phase 6: Participants will present their results in presence of the Netherlands Embassy and other relevant stakeholders.

Dates, location and language

In-country training

21-25 November 2021 – Algeria 28 November – 2 December 2021 - Egypt

Training in the Netherlands

March 2022 (tbc), The Hague, The Netherlands

The courses will be in English, with interpretation into Arabic. The dates and format of the training are subject to change. Participants are obliged to attend all parts in full. After completing the course, participants will receive a certificate.

Costs and fees

The Dutch government will take care of all relevant costs. This includes international travel, board and lodging, visa and insurance, and tuition fees for the course.

<u>All</u> applicants are responsible for the organisation and costs of travelling to the airport and the training location in their own country. Participants departing from an international airport outside their own country, will have to cover local travel expenses themselves and will be compensated for the international part of their journey. Participants are responsible for the organisation of their visa application.

In case of no-shows or cancellations within four weeks before the start of the first part of the training, the organisation has the right to claim all costs incurred from the participants' employer.

Application

Applications should be made online before 9 August 2021.

Click on 'register' and enter your personal information and login information. Click on 'register' and your account is created. Login to fill in the application form for 'Ecosystem for Entrepreneurs' and save the form. After saving your application form, you have successfully applied. You will receive a confirmation email.

Eligibility criteria:

- Administrative check. Fully documented applications received before the deadline.
- Match of job position and learning goals with the topics of the course and motivation.
- Between 5 and 10 years relevant work experience as civil servant in economic development, private sector support and entrepreneurship'.
- Participants should be willing and able to make available the time to 1) participate in all training activities and 2) develop and implement action plans;
- No (previous) participation in other Shiraka or Matra-South Training Programmes.

We encourage female civil servants to apply, as we highly value diversity amongst our participants. There are 10 places for civil servants available per country, which will be divided between relevant institutions. Per country, two entrepreneurs will be selected. A good command of the English is a plus.

Shiraka training programme

The course will be organised as part of the Shiraka programme, an initiative of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Netherlands. Shiraka is a Dutch bilateral effort dedicated to contributing to political development in the MENA region. Through this Shiraka training programme, the Netherlands Ministry of Foreign Affairs aims to stimulate and support sustainable transition in the MENA region and to strengthen relations between the Netherlands and the target countries.
